Submission Guidelines

We encourage submissions from all APUS students in the form of fiction, poetry, and creative non-fiction. We also accept digital photography. Submissions will be reviewed anonymously by a board of students and their faculty advisor. Authors will retain the copyright on their work so that they may publish in multiple publications.

The *APUS Eagle* will publish twice a year in May and December with submission deadlines in March for the May issue and October for the December issue. Submissions should be sent to apuslitmag@sunflower.com. Publication will be in electronic format (pdf).

Students retain the rights to their submissions.

Guidelines

- Entire piece should be less than 15 pages.
- Writings must be done in English.

Submission Details

1. Include a **coversheet** with **your name, title of work, email/contact info., and APUS affiliation.**
2. **DO NOT include your name anywhere else** in the piece. This will facilitate our anonymous review process.
3. Please use **standard fonts and formats**, and **number your pages**
4. **Include the name of your piece in the name of your file** (e.g. my_title_is_this.doc).
5. Although MS Word format is preferred, you may also submit in pdf format, but if your piece is accepted for publication, we will request that you send us a .doc or .rtf version of your writing.
